



BOYCE WORTHLEY YOUNG ACHIEVER AWARD

This award honours one of the founding members of the College, Boyce Worthley, who was a senior physicist with the Anti-Cancer Foundation, Adelaide. He became the College's first Life Member.

This is awarded to a younger member of the College for a significant contribution to the profession of physical and engineering sciences in medicine, generally with several publications in refereed journals as a primary author.

Prize: EPSM conference registration, travel and accommodation (the following year).

Minimum Criteria:

- Associate Member of ACPSEM financial member of 12 months standing
- Applicant to be within the first 15 years of their profession, or within 10 years of gaining professional certification
- Will have made a substantial contribution to the physical or engineering medical sciences, demonstrated by several publications as primary author in referred journals

Judging Criteria:

- The number of refereed publications, including those as first author
- Contribution to clinical practice
- Conference contributions and involvement
- Tertiary qualifications
- Teaching experience
- ACPSEM registration in one or more specialty





How to Apply

All fellows, members and associate members of the ACPSEM can nominate persons for this award.
