The College has been successful in securing further funding for registrar training from 2022 and an announcement for new grants will be available soon; this is a fantastic outcome for our members as it supports training and development for TEAPs and the members who support them. The effective implementation of deformable image registration (DIR) provides the potential for significant advancements in margin reduction, adaptive radiotherapy, and biological modelling. For all this promise, current DIR algorithms vary considerably in their ability to safely meet these goals. The release of this position paper provides support for the Australasian clinical community with guidelines for the safe use of DIR technology.
